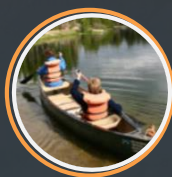
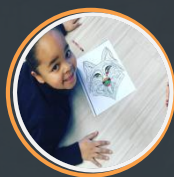

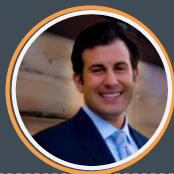
2018

DENVER KIDS INC

Every student counts. Every student graduates.

81% of program students graduated on-time, as compared to the District's 62% for low-income students

FLORENCE CRITTENTON

Where hope comes to life.

87% of eligible seniors completed high school—more than double the national average of 38% for girls who become mothers by age 18

TRANSFORMATIVE | COMMUNITY IMPACT

Denver Active 20-30 funds grants to build capacity and capability in emerging non-profits.



TENNYSON CENTER

Empower children who have experienced abuse, neglect, and trauma to bravely and safely change their life's story.

96% of youth maintained family placements and 82% of youth avoided hospitalization/crisis stability services

LA CLINICA TEPEYAC

Provide culturally competent health care and preventive health services for the medically underserved.

Only 4% of babies born in prenatal program were preterm, and 7% had a low birth weight, well below the state averages of 8.7% and 8.8%

ENVIRONMENTAL LEARNING FOR KIDS

Cultivate a passion in science, leadership, and service in a diverse community of learners..

87% of program alumni are in college/graduated and 56% are majoring or working in STEM fields

GOLD STANDARD | GRANT REVIEW PROCESS

Denver Active 20-30 members perform due diligence on all grant applicants, conduct site visits, and determine funding.

For the 2017-2018 funding cycle, 137 grant applicants requested more than \$2.4M in funds.

Sixty-five non-profits received nearly \$1M in grants in 2018.



APPLICATIONS

Non-profits spanning Education, Health & Well Being, Child Advocacy, and Personal Enrichment – request grants.



ONSITE VISITS

Every Denver Active 20-30 member conducts at least one, and sometimes two, onsite visits to evaluate applicant eligibility.



EVALUATION

The member-led Grant Review Committee evaluates the portfolio of member recommendations, proposing a grant slate.



APPROVAL

The entire membership reviews the proposed grants, advocates for changes, then votes to finalize the grant slate.
